Bees for Development	Sustainable Livelihoods, Climate Change and Lifelong Learning	Somaliland/South Wales	People in rural areas in Somaliland are some of the most impoverished in the world. Yet they have access to bees and flowers which - with knowledge and skills - they can sustainably utilise to generate income. This project will enable 50 of the poorest families in Arbsiyo, Gabiley Region to learn beekeeping and establish small-scale apiaries. We aim to import beeswax to Wales.	£15,000
Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board (Glan Clywd Ethiopia Link)	Health	Ethiopia/North Wales	In support of a new Emergency Unit at our partner hospital in Hossana Hospital, Ethiopia, our link project aims to undertake teaching and training of Ethiopian partner colleagues themed around Emergency, Trauma and Eye care as well as providing organisational and IT infrastructure support. We look to strengthen relationships between our departments in Wales and Ethiopia and to support sustainable development of healthcare services in Hossana.	£6,034

Over a period of one year, we will deliver training and education in order to improve the children's life chances.	£5,000

Interburns	Health	Malawi/ West Wales	Burns are a major public health challenge in sub-Saharan Africa and a leading cause of preventable death and disability. Malawi's burn care services are extremely limited for a country with a population of 18 million people, with just 2 dedicated units, a dearth of trained staff and a complete lack of prevention programmes. This project will assess the current capacity of existing services and develop a national strategy to transform the standard of care nationally, adapting the approach of similar, successful projects in Ghana and Ethiopia.	£15,000
PONT	Sustainable Livelihoods	Mbale /South Wales	PONT wants to make our fundraising sustainable, while bringing volunteering to more people in Wales and global issues to a wider audience. We need a Volunteer Manager in RCT to build capacity. They will recruit and support volunteers, produce resources and co-ordinate events. Volunteers will gain skills, knowledge, community; PONT will support health, education and livelihoods projects in Mbale.	£6,880
Salt Peter Trust	Health	Uganda/South Wales	Making every contact count, the project will provide free child health screening and treatment in outreach pop-up clinics. This will address the gaps in provision from government health services and NGOs. A team from Wales will support clinicians from the Soroti Baptist Medical Centre to develop a sustainable, high-impact programme.	£15,000

Swansea Bay University Health Board	Health	Zimbabwe/West Wales	We want to work with RMC champions who emerged from our earlier RMC training in 2018 in Zimbabwe, to develop locally accessible and appealing materials and a training toolkit using their experience of applying what they were taught in their workplaces. These champions will take these learning methods to a larger group of practitioners so that RMC becomes embedded in maternity care in Zimbabwe.	£15,000
Tools for Self Reliance	Sustainable Livelihoods	Tanzania /Mid Wales	The project will deliver a sustainable future for women's and disabled tailoring groups in two regions of Tanzania. It will provide refurbished sewing machines and deliver practical and business training to these groups. It will also identify and train regional networks of sewing machine mechanics who will maintain the machines into the future.	£15,000
